

# Midterm for MATH 5345H: Introduction to Topology

1. Let  $X$  and  $Y$  be topological spaces, and let  $f : X \rightarrow Y$  be a function. Define

$$Z := \{f(x) \mid x \in X\} \subseteq Y$$

to be the image of the function  $f$ , and equip  $Z$  with the topology as a subspace of  $Y$ . Define  $\bar{f} : X \rightarrow Z$  by  $\bar{f}(x) = f(x)$ . Show that  $f$  is continuous if and only if  $\bar{f}$  is continuous.

2. Let  $\mathbb{Q}$  denote the rational numbers.

- (a) Let  $T_{order}$  denote the order topology on  $\mathbb{Q}$  with respect to the usual  $<$ , and let  $T_{subspace}$  denote the subspace topology on  $\mathbb{Q}$ , as a subspace of  $\mathbb{R}$  with the standard topology. Show that  $T_{order} = T_{subspace}$ .
- (b) Are the two topologies in the previous problem the same as the discrete topology? Why or why not?

3. Give  $\mathbb{R}$  the standard topology, and let  $A = \mathbb{Q}$ , regarded as a subset of  $\mathbb{R}$ . Show that  $\bar{A} = \mathbb{R}$ . What are the set of limit points of  $A$ ?

4. Let  $Y = \{a, b\}$  be a set with two elements, let  $X$  be any set, and let  $P(X)$  be the power set of  $X$  (i.e., the set of subsets of  $X$ ).

- (a) Write  $Y^X := \{f : X \rightarrow Y\}$  for the set of functions from  $X$  to  $Y$ . Show that the function

$$\alpha : Y^X \rightarrow P(X) \text{ given by } \alpha(f) = f^{-1}(a)$$

is a bijection.

- (b) Let  $T_Y = \{\emptyset, \{a\}, Y\} \subseteq P(Y)$ . I claim that  $T_Y$  is a topology on  $Y$  – this is easy to verify, and you do not need to do so.

Now assume, further, that  $X$  has a topology  $T_X$ . Prove that  $\alpha$  restricts to a bijection

$$\alpha : \{f : X \rightarrow Y \mid f \text{ is continuous}\} \rightarrow T_X = \{U \subseteq X \mid U \text{ is open}\}.$$

5. A subset  $A \subseteq X$  is said to be *dense* if  $\bar{A} = X$ . If  $A \subseteq X$  and  $B \subseteq Y$  are both dense, show that  $A \times B$  is dense in  $X \times Y$  (in the product topology).
