But in this case, the essential invariants I_{yy}, I_{xxy}, I_{xxx} do generate all higher order differential invariants. Indeed, the first two recurrence formulas are

$$\mathcal{D}_1 I_{yy} = I_{xxy} + I_{xyy}, \quad \mathcal{D}_2 I_{yy} = I_{xxy} + I_{xyy} + I_{yyy}, \quad (7.10)$$

while all the rest are exactly the same as in (7.6)–(7.7). Observe that we are now able to write the non-essential edge invariants I_{xyy}, I_{xxyy} , as well as all the non-edge differential invariants, in terms of I_{yy}, I_{xxy}, I_{xxx} .
